Forest management

We work to create old-growth forest reserves and to promote forest management geared towards carbon storage, timber valuation and non-timber utilisation. As well, Rewilding Spain partners with local communities and generate economic compensation mechanisms to facilitate these goals.



Rivers restoration

We restore critical freshwater habitats to improve their connectivity and species dispersal. We have contributed to the removal of dams in the Cabrillas river and to the analysis of the genetic footprint of species of special interest in the landscape.



Species reintroduction

Disappeared key species comeback is essential to complete food chains and recover damaged ecological processes. We are fostering the return of large herbivores (horses and tauros), *scavengers (cinereous vulture and bearded* vulture), birds of prey (red kite) and predators *(lberian lynx).*



Socio-economic development

Ecotourism, handicraft, agri-food production, and environmental education bring new opportunities for rural entrepreneurship. We support nature-based economic initiatives which leverage the unique values of our landscape, thus fostering sustainable economic development and job creation. Rewilding Spain facilitates mutual knowledge, provides visibility to the area, and helps with funding.
